FROM THE DESK OF THE MAYOR

Dear Cudahy Residents,

I hope most of you are enjoying the unseasonably warmer winter we are experiencing. For those of you that ski, snowmobile, and ice fish, it has not been enjoyable. You won't find me complaining about lack of snow to shovel and the lower heating bills.

On January 16th, 2024, multiple fire departments from surrounding areas including the Cudahy Fire Department responded to a fire at Washington Square Apartments on Packard and Barnard Avenues. Due to the quick response, everyone exited the building on their own or with the help of the firefighters on the scene. The size, timing and circumstances of weather required involvement from every department including Dispatch, Police, Fire, Public Works, Water, Health, Library, and Administration responded to ensure that all residents were safely moved from their apartments to temporary shelters. A shout out to the fire departments of South Milwaukee, St. Francis, Oak Creek and Milwaukee for their assistance. An additional thanks to the Red Cross who assisted residents in finding them temporary shelter.

We have already started planning for the 2024 4th of July Celebration. We should have information out on activities in late March or early April. Once again, the plan is to launch the fireworks from the Sheridan Park lagoon. I recommend you take a minute and read about the other upcoming events by our library and local organizations for the spring and summer.

At the end of 2023, the Common Council completed a 5-year strategic plan. One of the top priorities is business development. Here is a list of some of the projects that have been approved.

- A 60,000 square foot light manufacturing warehouse/office was approved on Pennsylvania Ave at the site of the former South Woods restaurant.
- The Community Development Authority is currently working on a redevelopment district plan for South Packard Avenue including the former K-Mart property.
- The city is working on developing a concept plan for the vacant land located on Packard Ave. by the Cudahy Family Library parking lot. More details on that proposal on page 13 of the newsletter.

And last but not least, I need to ask for your help. There is a proposal that is gaining traction to remove portions of I-794 in the City of Milwaukee from Lincoln Memorial Drive to 2nd Street. What does that mean for you? It means that if you use I-794 to connect to I-94 or I-43, going north or south, you will have to exit I-794 and travel along Clybourn Ave until you reach 2nd & Clybourn and get back on I-794 to connect to I-94 or I-43. This project would be detrimental to our residents and businesses who have located in Cudahy and South Shore due to the connection of I-794. Please review our article on I-794 and join Cudahy, South Milwaukee, and St. Francis in support of the I-794 alternative that makes improvements to the existing route and providing the City of Milwaukee with land for future development.

I-794 LAKE INTERCHANGE STUDY

The Wisconsin Department of Transportation is studying and evaluating alternatives for the Interstate 794 Lake Interchange in the City of Milwaukee. The area of study is roughly from the Milwaukee River to the Hoan Bridge. The study began in 2023 when WisDOT provided nine design concepts and solicited public feedback as well as worked with the Federal Highway Administration, the City of Milwaukee and Milwaukee County. From there WisDOT is looking at the following options:

- **Replace the Freeway in Kind:** this would include the reconstruction of the freeway in its existing location.
- **Freeway Improvement:** This would include keeping the freeway but would change the design to make the overall footprint smaller and improve the safety of the freeway.
- **Freeway Removal:** This would include the complete removal of the freeway from essentially Lincoln Memorial Drive to 2nd Street. All traffic in this section would be moved to street level in Milwaukee, as Clybourn Avenue would be reconstructed to handle the new amount of traffic.

The Cities of Cudahy, St. Francis and South Milwaukee are in favor of any project that includes a freeway improvement option. This option provides the best results for all the interested parties. It continues to allow for a freeway that provides the necessary freeway connectivity to the South Shore communities. It will reduce the overall footprint of the freeway, thus freeing up areas within the City of Milwaukee for potential re-development. Finally, it improves driver safety for those using I-794, a specific goal of WisDOT.

WisDOT plans to hold another series of meetings to hear comments from the public. At this time, these meetings are anticipated in the Spring of 2024. Cudahy will provide information on the proposed meeting dates when they become available.

The WisDOT is still seeking public comments for their study. If you are interested in providing comments or would like to know more about the study, you can do so by scanning the QR code below.

NEW Badger Books

Wisconsin's Electronic Poll Book

Coming to a Polling Place near you! The Badger Book is an e-poll book. What does that mean?

“E” stands for electronic, A Badger Book is a: poll book, absentee ballot log, digital voter registration form



What can a Badger Book do for you?

- Quicker voter check-ins and registrations,
- Process absentees in a snap,
- Improve polling place flow,
- No more splitting poll books,
- Reduce poll worker mistakes,
- Improve data quality,
- Consolidate polling locations,
- Requires fewer election inspectors,
- Streamlined post-election data entry and reconciliation,
- View voter participation sooner in MyVote.

How Does the Badger Book work on Election Day?

Prior to Election Day, the poll book for the entire municipality is loaded onto the Badger Book. Badger Books complete three tasks on Election Day.

- Check in voters,
- Register new voters,
- Process absentee ballots.

After Election Day, participation data is taken from the Badger Book and uploaded into WisVote including in-person participation, absentee participation and information from Election Day registrations.

Are Badger Books safe?

There are multiple layers of security to protect the system and voter information.

- Badger Books are **NEVER** connected to the internet,
- Data loaded onto Badger Books comes from WisVote (the secure statewide voter registration system),
- Badger Books are password protected and each poll worker has their own user credentials to log into the application,
- Voter and participation data is encrypted and secure,
- Badger Books communicate via a wireless router, but only within the polling place,
- Like a paper poll book, only the data necessary to run an election is included. **NO PERSONAL IDENTIFIABLE INFORMATION (PII) IS ACCESSIBLE.**

Cudahy Police Chaplain

The Cudahy Police Department has named Pastor Rachel Wesley as its chaplain. Pastor Wesley is a lifelong Cudahy resident and full-time pastor at Cudahy Christian Church.

The chaplain is a volunteer position which provides spiritual support, encouragement, guidance and counseling to our law enforcement personnel and their families. "After seeing the high levels of stress, danger, grief and trauma that our police and first responders deal with, I felt called to minister to them", said Pastor Wesley. She completed chaplain certification and worked with our officers to develop and implement this chaplain program.

Pastor Wesley also provides compassionate care to the people in our community. She earned her Chaplain Certification through the Chaplains College School of Graduate Studies. This qualifies her to work with law enforcement and fire departments, as well as the community members.

There are times the chaplain will be called in to assist with major incidents or sensitive situations, such as fires, accidents, and death notifications. The chaplain will be there to assist the police and to offer support, comfort and prayer to our residents. "I feel blessed and grateful that God has allowed me to serve in this role. I look forward to making a positive impact in people's lives", said Pastor Wesley.

Pastor Wesley has received training that is specific to law enforcement, through the Billy Graham Evangelistic Association's Law Enforcement Chaplain Training Program. Topics included Law Enforcement Ministry, History of Law Enforcement, Counseling, Grief, Suicide Awareness and Intervention, Pain and Substance Abuse in Law Enforcement, Law Enforcement's Impact on Families, Unique Needs and Challenges for Law Enforcement, and Chaplain Responsibilities and Guidelines.

Pastor Wesley is also completing police chaplain training through the International Conference of Police Chaplains (ICPC).

Tornado and Severe Weather Awareness Week

April 8- 12

The annual campaign encourages everyone to prepare for the severe storms Wisconsin frequently experiences during the Spring and Summer months. Statewide tornado drills are scheduled for 1:45 p.m. and 6:45 p.m. on April 11.

To stay safe during severe weather, follow these tips:

- Create an emergency plan in your home and practice it.
- Know where designated shelters are at home, work and school.
- Have the ability to monitor and receive severe weather alerts by enabling “Wireless Emergency Alerts (WEA)” on your mobile device. The WEA option can be found in the settings menu of your phone.
- Monitor severe weather by using a NOAA Weather Radio or local media. Stay alert for outdoor warning sirens.
- Have an emergency kit for your home (more information below).

Families should prepare for all hazards. Creating a disaster supply kit will help overcome any short-term disaster from a weather event to a fire in the home. Home disaster kits are easy to create and should be readily available when needed. The following are some suggestions on what to include in a disaster kit:

- A three-day supply of water and food that won't spoil.
- One change of clothes per person.
- One blanket or sleeping bag per person.
- A first aid kit including any prescription medications.
- A portable radio, flashlight and plenty of batteries.
- Food and medicine for pets.

RESIDENTIAL KNOX BOX

The Cudahy Fire Department sponsors the Lock Box program for the residents of Cudahy. The Residential Knox-Box provides a secure means of access to your home in case of an emergency.

The Residential KNOX-BOX® is a high security key safe that only local fire department responders can access.

With a residential KNOX-BOX installed, the Fire Department can respond quickly, without forcing entry and causing injury. They simply remove your entrance key stored inside the box, provide medical assistance, and return the key to the KNOX-BOX. When you purchase one of the boxes, the Fire Department does not charge for installation of the KNOX box and there are no monthly fees for having this box on your property.

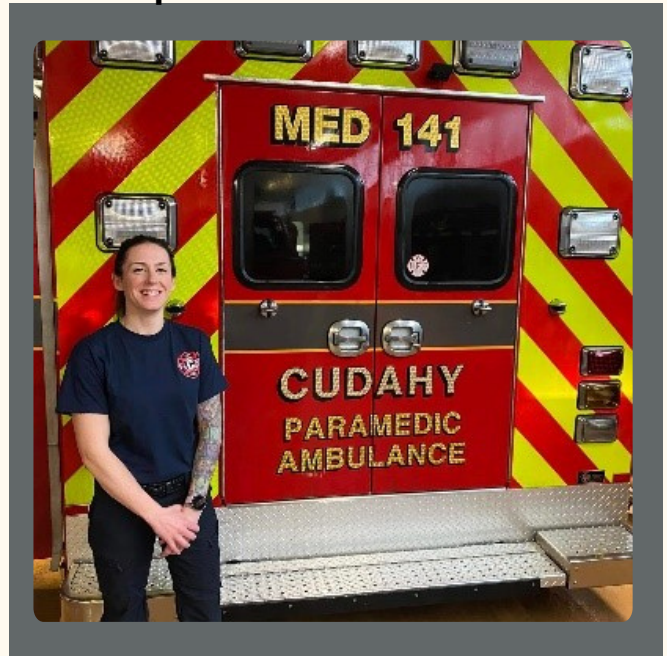

Another addition to the newly constructed Fire Station will be an old, historic kitchen table. It is often said that the heart of any home is often its kitchen table. INSPECTIONS

Home Improvement Projects– Remember to Apply for Permits

Spring is the time when many property owners start their home improvement projects. Many projects, even if the homeowner is doing the work, require a permit to be issued by the City prior to the start of construction. If you're unsure if your project will require a permit, the City maintains a list of common projects at www.cudahy-wi.gov. You can contact the Inspection Department at 414-769-2208. If you hire a contractor, be sure to check that they have pulled the required permits, as it's the property owners' responsibility to ensure the required permits are obtained.



Applying for a permit is now easier than ever! The Inspection Department has transitioned to online permitting. Permit applications are accepted on the City's Community Connect website: cudahywi.ourcommunityconnect.com. All permit information, application materials and payments can be made online.

Milwaukee County Home Repair Loan Program



The Milwaukee County Housing Division offers no interest loans to income-qualified homeowners. The loans can cover a wide range of repairs needed to maintain a home including roofing, gutters, siding, doors, windows, electric, plumbing and heating. Loans can also be used for emergency repairs relating to health and safety.

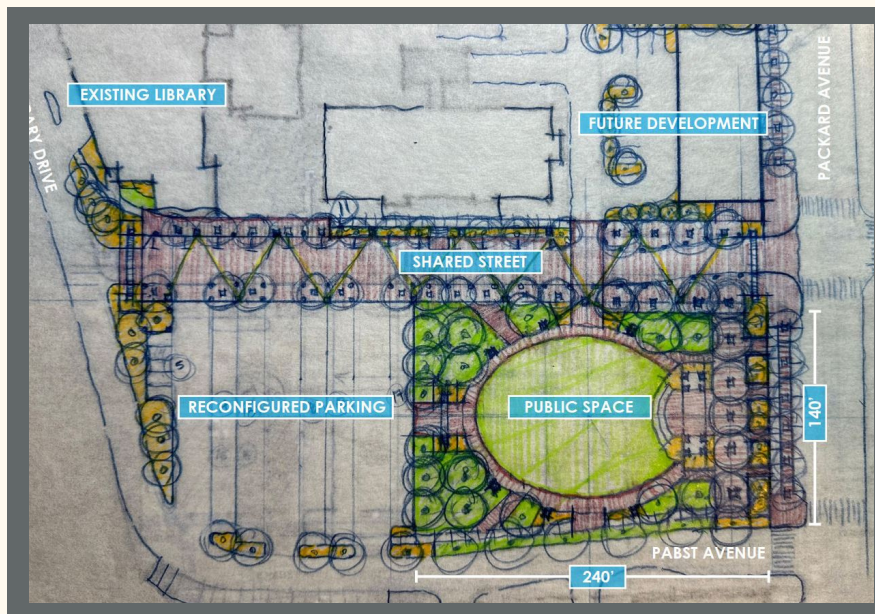
COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Packard Avenue Public Space Project

For the past five months, the city has been working with the planning and design firm Graef to development of a plan for a public gathering space that would allow for better utilization as an active community space. The area of focus is the 4800 block of S. Packard Avenue, centered on two vacant lots owned by the city as well as the public parking lot behind those lots and adjacent to the Cudahy Family Library.



Three concepts were examined that included reconfiguration of parking lots, streets and open space. From these concepts, a more detailed concept plan was developed (shown below), which includes a flexible public gathering space with a central lawn that can accommodate multiple different type of events, surrounded by a walking path ring with plantings and an eastern stage and seating area that could include a pavilion building or covered shelter.



The Plan Commission and Common Council will be reviewing the proposed concept plan at the meetings on March 12 and March 19. After the meetings, the City will likely solicit input from the public, potentially via an open house in the Spring. Once a final design is settled upon, staff will work to develop a project budget then seek potential avenues to fund the construction of the project.

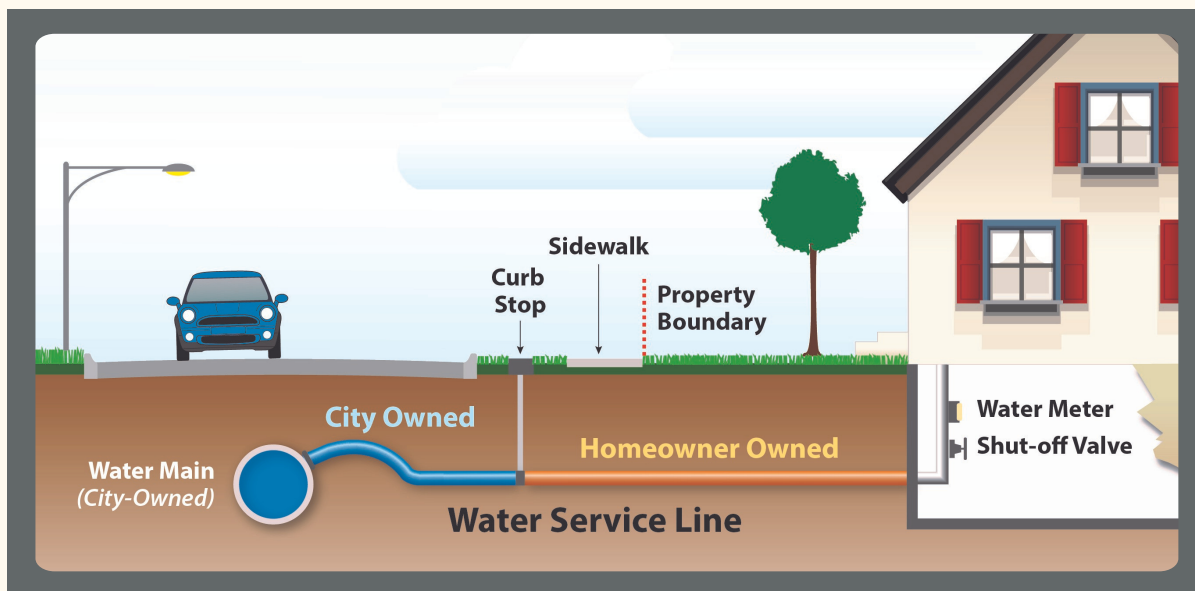
WATER UTILITY

In December of 2020 the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) released their Lead and Copper Rule Revisions (LCRR) to strengthen the protection of public health against lead exposure. The LCRR creates more strict requirements for when systems must optimize their corrosion control treatment and replace lead service lines (LSL). The LCRR also includes changes to the sampling protocol for lead by collecting samples from homes with lead service lines and water likely in contact with those lead services. In November of 2023, the EPA proposed LCR Improvements (LCRI) with more strict requirements that would override the LCRR, if the proposed LCRI is passed as written. The LCRI would require all systems to replace 10% of their LSLs each year for 10 years. This is mandated by the USEPA and WIDNR (until all LSLs are removed). The LCRI would also lower the lead action level to 10 ppb of lead, instead of the current 15 ppb.

The primary sources of lead in water are the lead service lines and in-home premise plumbing as the water leaving the treatment plant is free of lead. The Cudahy Water Utility has taken proactive steps to comply with these EPA regulations and has completed a review of the corrosion control treatment process and has developed a service line material inventory. In addition, the City is developing a Lead Service Line Replacement (LSLR) plan that will consider funding, prioritization, implementation, and outreach in replacing the City's lead service lines.

Replacement of the LSL's will be a major task, our current inventory shows the City has about 1700 full or partial LSL's. The cost to replace each City owned line will be \$5000-\$7000 depending on the road material and the cost to replace the privately-owned portion will be \$4500-\$5500. If 10% of these lines are being replaced each year the cost for the Utility portion could be \$1.2 million per year. While there may be funding available to assist residents in replacing their portion of the lines, there is no guarantee on how much funding will be available or how much assistance each resident will receive.

For all systems conducting or planning to replace LSLs, the EPA requires replacing LSLs in full and not leaving any portions of an LSL in use, except in emergency replacements. For communities like Cudahy, who share ownership of the service line between the city and the homeowner, replacing LSLs in full will require coordination and collaboration between both parties. The figure below shows how this responsibility is split between homeowners and the city. For any questions about lead or if you have a lead service line, the water Utility at 414-769-2237.



WATER UTILITY

What's On The Water Bills?

All water bills will contain the following information:

- Account number,
- Due date of current water bill,
- Amount due on/before due date,
- Amount due if paid after the due date,
- Billing address,
- Mailing address,
- Usage dates and meter readings.

The description of charges will itemize the dollar amount for a resident's water/ sewer service:

Balance Forward is any past due amounts not paid from prior water/sewer service.

Water is the amount of water used during the service months.

Connection Charge is the cost to be connected to Cudahy's water system, even if there is no water used.

Sewer Local is the cost to be connected to Cudahy's sewer system, even if there is no water used.

MMSD (Milwaukee Metropolitan Sewer District) are charges for the wastewater treatment plant.

Storm Water is the cost to be connected to Cudahy's storm water system, even if there is no water used.

Public/ Private Fire is to supply use and maintenance on all fire hydrants located in the City of Cudahy.

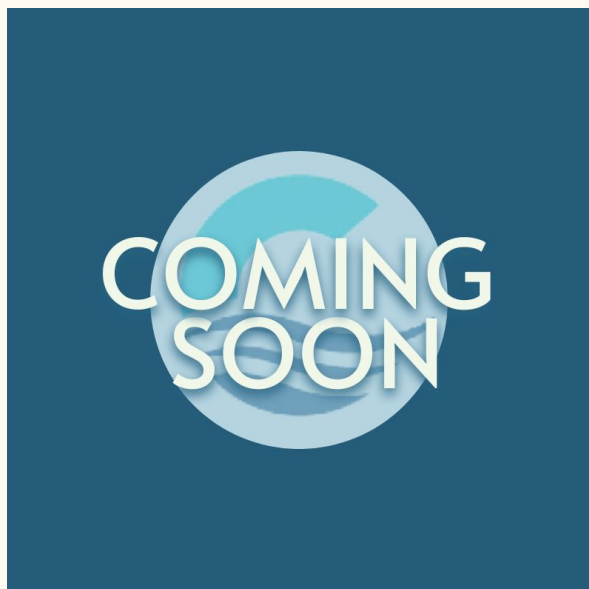

PUBLIC WORKS

Visitors and residents are greeted into the City of Cudahy by five welcome signs. The welcome signs are one of the many areas focused on to showcase flower displays. This season, residents can plan to see tall multicolored Zinnias that the bees will love, bright eye-catching Antigua, Yellow Marigolds and Midnight Madness Petunias around these areas.

Another main focus is downtown Packard Avenue. This season Packard Avenue will host 34 planters and 34 hanging baskets. In the effort to “wow” passersby, Public Works will plant Snapstastic Snapdragons and Supertunia Vista Paradise Petunias in the planters and some butterfly favorites in the hanging baskets with trailing purple and pink petunias and Sunny Yellow Thumbergia.

NEW THIS YEAR! Updated flower beds at City Hall near the new digital sign. Public Works has kept in mind the possible foot traffic next to the sidewalk, so salt tolerant plants were chosen for the colder months. The plants chosen will be Orange Mighty Chestnut Daylilies, Karl Foerster Reed Grass and Moonshine Yarrow. Additionally, some pollinator perennial favorites like Catmint, Purple Cone Flower and Russian Sage were also chosen. With varying bloom times, the pollinators should have food all season long.

Next time residents visit City Hall check out the mix of perennial and annual flowers. Maybe you'll want to plant some in your yard this season too. For more information on planting in the City of Cudahy, please contact Public Works at 414-769-2216

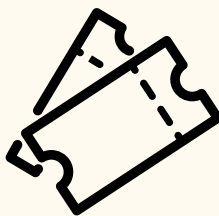
