FROM THE DESK OF THE MAYOR

The summer of 2024 is behind us, and it is time to get the rakes ready and the snowblowers tuned up. Overall, the summer weather was pretty pleasant with the exception of the period of extreme heat that caused portions of Pennsylvania Avenue to buckle. I want to recognize our DPW and Engineering department for quickly responding on a Sunday afternoon and making emergency repairs. On Monday we were fortunate to have a contractor working on some alley re-construction along Packard Ave and the contractor was re-assigned to immediately begin the repair. Pretty amazing to have that road up and running again in just 11 days.

Here are some upcoming events that you do not want to miss.

- Cudahy Lion's Oktoberfest, Saturday September 21, 2024, 1pm – 10pm
- Cudahy Christmas Parade, November 23rd, 2024, starting at 3pm followed by tree lighting and festivities at the Cudahy Family Library.
- Fire Station ribbon cutting and tours of the new fire station. We are still finalizing the details, but plan to hold the event on a Saturday in October.

City Matters

- We continue to search for a replacement for our City Administrator position. Staff, council, and I interviewed two candidates in July, but there was consensus that neither candidate would be a good fit for Cudahy. We are actively recruiting for the position.
- The months of September, October, and November are budget preparation time. We project a small increase in the allowable tax levy. Projections from our financial consultants estimate that we may be facing a \$500,000 shortfall. I will be making recommendations to the Common Council on how to close this gap and balance the budget.
- The DPW is planning to have additional hot patch (asphalt) on hand this winter to fill potholes over the winter. Last year was the first winter with our new hotbox trailer and we exhausted our supply of hot patch earlier than we had anticipated. The use of hot patch is a superior product and holds up much better to winter conditions than the cold patch we used in the past.
- The DPW has added a new "Free" electronics recycling program at the drop off-site. The cost is free, and you can now drop off those old electronics anytime the drop-off site is open.

Update on business development. Here is the status of some of the projects that have been approved.

- Scoot (Land by Label) – The final financial terms were approved by the Common Council at our August 2024 Common Council meeting. The movement of utilities and construction should begin this fall with a target to begin leasing portions of the apartment to occur in the fall of 2025. The estimated value of the project is \$19,000,000.
- The 60,000 square foot light manufacturing warehouse/office, developed by Land and Label has started construction on Pennsylvania Ave at the site of the former South Woods restaurant.
- The CDA has authorized the creation of a redevelopment plan #3 which comprises South Packard Ave, including Packard Plaza and the former Kmart site. SEWPRC has provided the CDA with information on blighted properties along the South Packard corridor.
- I-794- I cannot emphasize how important it is for residents and people that work in Cudahy to access the I-794 Project website and submit comments (QR code below) to oppose the de-construction of portions of I-794 in downtown Milwaukee. Your comments become a public record and show opposition to an idea that will have adverse effects on the cities along the South Shore.

Thank you, Cudahy!

This summer, the Milwaukee Metropolitan Sewerage District (MMSD) and the Fresh Coast Guardians worked with residents of the City of Cudahy to install green infrastructure in our neighborhoods. Through this initiative, residents learned the benefits of managing stormwater where it falls. Green infrastructure can capture, absorb, or store rain and melting snow. These efforts can help improve water quality in our rivers and Lake Michigan, reduce the risk of flooding and basement backups, beautify neighborhoods, and help manage water and sewer costs.

We have distributed over 100 rain barrels and planted several rain gardens for City residents. At Cudahy City Hall, we planted deep-rooted native flowers in a pollinator garden and installed a rain barrel. Rain gardens and native plants collect rain and melting snow, naturally absorbing them into the ground. By managing the rainwater where it falls, rain gardens reduce storm water runoff that can transport many pollutants to our local waterways and cause drainage issues.

Fall Clean Up

As with every year, Mother Nature dictates when the leaves will fall off of the trees. Unfortunately, this makes it difficult for the Public Works Department to set a date for leaf and yard waste pick up.

If there are leaves to be picked up, residents may start placing leaves curbside starting OCTOBER 15. Leaf and yard waste pick up will continue until the first snow fall.

What equals the first snow fall? We are so glad you asked! The first snow fall will be defined as 3+ inches of snow at one time. This amount of snow would be considered a major snow event and snowplows will be out clearing roadways.

Reminders for residents who would like to put leaves and yard waste curbside:

NO BRANCHES OR WOODY MATERIAL ARE ALLOWED.


DO NOT PLACE LEAVES OR YARD WASTE IN PLASTIC BAGS.

KEEP LEAF OR YARD WASTE PILES TO A MINIMUM OF 10 FEET AWAY FROM THE STORM DRAINS.

ALL LEAF AND YARD WASTE PILES MUST BE SEPERATE.

The City Drop Off Site also accepts all leaves, yard waste and branches every Thursday and Saturday in October and November (except November 21 and 23).

Traffic Safety

We see repeated media coverage on the topic of reckless driving. Like every community, traffic infractions occur in the City of Cudahy.

We expect that police officers make decisions on initiating a lawful and appropriate traffic stops and that they take appropriate action on violations. Cudahy Police Officers are encouraged to educate motorists. The options available for a police officer who lawfully initiates a stop are verbal warning, written warning, ticket, or custodial arrest. It is at the discretion of the police officer, guided by the philosophy of the police department, to determine what the appropriate level of enforcement may be in any situation.

Traffic enforcement is done through use of both marked police vehicles and unmarked police vehicles, depending on the strategy being used at the time.

While traffic safety is certainly the primary reason for traffic enforcement, traffic enforcement is also an important method of crime prevention. Traffic enforcement increases police presence in our community, and it presents an opportunity for police officers to identify and apprehend people engaged in criminal activity or who have warrants for their arrest.

Cudahy Police Officers are assigned a beat during rollcall. The beat is a specific patrol area and is used to increase police presence in specific neighborhoods. Added police presence is intended to enhance traffic safety and act as a crime deterrent. Our beat assignments are also a community policing strategy.

Officers are routinely assigned directed patrol missions. Directed patrol missions are based on complaints, police officer observations, or events that require an increased police presence in an area.

The City of Cudahy receives grant funding for OWI enforcement, speed enforcement, and seatbelt enforcement. This funding is collaboration between Cudahy, South Milwaukee, St. Francis, and Oak Creek, to enhance traffic safety.

The Cudahy Police Department maintains close communication with the Cudahy School District to address traffic-related and other concerns. The School Resource Officers, enhance communication between the police department and the school district. Our school crossing guards are our first line to keep watch on our children in the school zones and are a direct line of communication with our department to relay concerns. As staffing and call volume allow, directed patrol missions are assigned to our patrol staff in school zones.

We encourage open lines of communication with concerned community members. We are always available to discuss matters and problem solve.

FIRE DEPARTMENT

With the cooler temperatures approaching, backyard fire pits are a popular option for families and friends to spend time together. Fire pits are permitted with the following conditions; they shall be located 10ft away from any combustibile material, placed on a non-combustible surface, have a spark arresting screen around the entire unit, and have its designated cover in place during operation. Any fires shall not be used between the hours of Midnight and 6:00am, supervised at all times by an adult, and have the proper means for extinguishment ready to use close by. FIRE DEPARTMENT

The City of Cudahy Fire Department in partnership with The American Red Cross offer The Home Fire Campaign, which provides smoke detectors for distribution and installation at no cost. The program focuses on families of low income homes with people over the age of 65 or under 18 residing in them and areas with high historical incidence of home fire, death and injuries.

Replace your alarms after 10 years.
Smoke alarms do not last forever. If your alarms are 10 years old or older, replace them with new alarms.

All smoke detectors will be installed by the Cudahy Fire Department to insure proper placement and installation. If someone is hard of hearing or deaf the Red Cross can obtain bedside alarms/bed shakers to help alert them of an emergency. Adopt-A-Fire Hydrant



The fire department needs your help keeping hydrants clear this winter. If you have a hydrant near your property and you are able, please make sure snow and ice are clear three feet around after every snow event. Caring for a Hydrant closest to your home or business and keeping it clear of snow and debris allows firefighters to quickly respond to an emergency. Meaning, you can help make our community safer.



WINTER WEATHER AWARENESS WEEK



SAFETY AT HOME

- Make sure your home is well insulated.
- Check battery powered equipment, and stock extra batteries for flashlights and a portable television/radio.
- Keep some type of emergency heating equipment available so you can keep at least one room warm enough to be livable. **Practice Fire Safety!**
- Stock an emergency supply of food/water.
- Keep water pipes from freezing by wrapping them in insulation. Let faucets drip a little.
- Stay indoors during cold snaps. Elderly persons, children, and those in bad health may be especially susceptible to cold weather.
- Move livestock to sheltered areas. For pets, bring them indoors or provide some form of heat. Provide them with fresh water as well.
- Dress to fit the season. Wear loose, layered clothing.
- Check your supply of heating fuel.



TEN TIPS FOR FIRE SAFETY

- 1 Install smoke alarms on every level of your home, inside bedrooms and outside sleeping areas.
- 2 Test smoke alarms monthly. Replace batteries at least once a year.
- 3 Have a family fire escape plan and practice the plan twice a year.
- 4 If there's a fire in your home, get out, dial 911 and don't go back inside.
- 5 Keep matches and lighters out of children's reach.
- 6 Use flashlights during power outages, not candles.
- 7 Never leave a burning candle unattended.
- 8 Turn off space heaters when you leave the room and don't leave them unattended.
- 9 Only use smoking materials outside.
- 10 Keep flammable items away from anything that can get hot, such as space heaters.

Community Portal Now Open to All Residents

The Water Utility has been working hard to make all water accounts accessible online through the new Community Connect Portal.

The new portal will give all residents access to:

- View Current Bills and Usage
- Sign up for Paperless billing
- Pay current or past due bills via credit card or e-check
- Sign up for automatic withdrawal

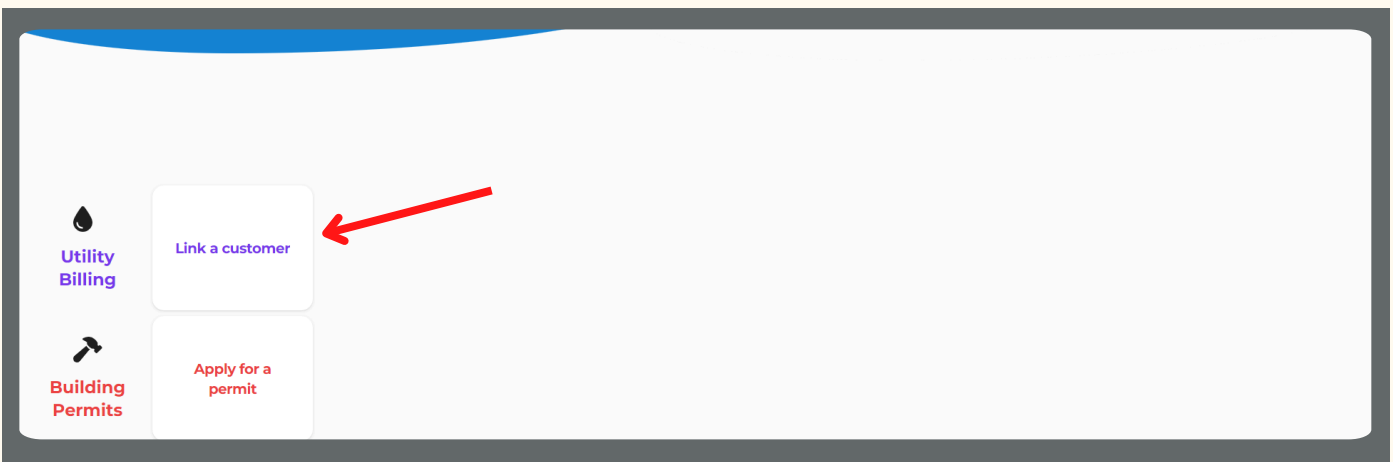


Create an Account

Select “create your account”

Participants must enter a valid email address and a valid password. Phone numbers are optional, however if text message alerts are requested, a valid phone number must be entered. Once all fields have been entered, click “register”.

A verification email will be sent. ALL participants must verify their account via a confirmation email. Once the account is verified, access to the portal will be open to link your water utility account. Once logged in, the home screen will resemble the picture below:

Link a Water Utility Account

Residents will need to know the water account number for the property. This number will go into the “Customer Number” field. For example, 000000-00

Most water utility accounts are listed under “Owner/Occupant”. Therefore most will not be able to enter a “Last Name”.

HANDY TIPS TO AVOID FROZEN PIPES THIS WINTER



BEFORE THE COLD WEATHER SETS IN



Check sprinkler or irrigation systems. Make sure everything is turned off and drained.



Eliminate sources of cold air near water lines. Fix drafty windows and plug drafts around doors. Identify your home's freezing points.



Know how to shut off your water.



Protect your pipes. Wrap them with insulation.

WHEN TEMPERATURES STAY BELOW FREEZING



If pipes run through cabinets or vanities, open the doors to let warmer room temperatures flow in.



Keep water moving through the pipes by allowing a small trickle of water to run.

BUT IF YOUR PIPES DO FREEZE



Shut off the water immediately.



Thaw pipes with warm air, with a hair dryer or space heater. Do not leave space heaters unattended and do not use kerosene heaters or open flames.



Be careful turning water back on. Once pipes are thawed, slowly turn the water back on and check pipes and joints for any cracks.

IT'S ALL ABOUT PREVENTION

Frozen pipes can leave you without water in the worst of weather. And cost a lot to repair. But with a few simple steps, you can easily preserve both your budget and your peace of mind.

Free Electronics Recycling Program

Legacy Recycling an R2 certified/ WI DNR registered recycler is now offering FREE permanent site recycling for all electronic devices and appliances. Any municipality that wishes to offer electronics recycling at their recycle yard/center can now offer it to their residents for no charge for any device.

Benefits:

- Zero fees to the municipality and residents
- Legacy recycles all electronic devices, appliances, and rechargeable batteries
- Legacy supplies bins, cages, or shipping containers at no cost to the municipality. All adhere to WI DNR standards.
- Legacy does all the loading and handling of materials
- Legacy destroys all personal data as a community service

Accepted Electronics:

Any device that you can plug into an outlet or that runs on batteries we can recycle it.

How can it be Free:

Legacy Recycling became registered as a recycler with the state of WI in 2023. Doing so opened up opportunities to offer better recycling for the residents. Once a facility registers as a recycler it allows them to work directly with manufacturers that make electronics. Per the WI DNR if those manufacturers want to sell their products in WI they are required to subsidize the cost of recycling in WI. That subsidizing is designed to help residents cover the cost of recycling the items that would normally have fees. There are only about 6 registered recyclers located in the state and only a couple in Southeastern WI. Where Legacy shines is that we are also registered as a collector of electronics with the state. Being dual registered it allows us to work with both the manufacturers and also directly with residents.
