The Town will have the new Town Attorney setup a 501 (c)(3), Friends of The Park, to legally raise money for the Town. This will enable the Committee to fundraise for the celebration.
- iv. Parade – Member Hurd was nominated to head, due to her experience
- v. Fireworks – Member AC Rich, YFD, was nominated to head
- vi. Children’s & Adult Activities – headed by Member McLaughlin
 - 1. Scrapbook & Quilting Project – Women’s Club

Member Page recommended having Hurd present a suggested timeline at the next meeting. He also suggested that all Members bring three fundraising ideas, three activities, and three events.
